The 7.45pm match, will be the first time the Lionesses have played in the East Midlands city since a 1–1 draw with Sweden on 17 September 1980.






STADIUM MAP

BYTRAIN

Leicester Rail Station is roughly 1.2 miles from King Power Stadium. This equates to an approximate five-minute car journey or a 25-minute walk.

The route from the station to the King Power Stadium is well signposted and local buses are in operation within Leicester City Centre for quick and direct links to the stadium.

TO WALK FROM LEICESTER TRAIN STATION:

1

Cross London Road at the traffic lights, turn left and follow the road to King Power Stadium around to the right.



Keep the Central Ring Road (Waterloo Way) on your left as the path separates from the road, staying on this path as it crosses New Walk.



The path then re-joins the pavement, at which point Nelson Mandela Park will be in view.



Turn right onto Lancaster Road and walk through the park, heading for the crossings by the public toilets.



Cross Welford Road and turn left, following the road around – passing Morrisons supermarket – to King Power Stadium.

BY BUS


Several bus services run from Leicester city centre to the King Power Stadium, stopping on Aylestone Road, which is a five-minute walk from King Power Stadium.

Most buses in Leicester are low floor vehicles, meaning they can provide level access once the bus has stopped.

All buses include wheelchair spaces.

ON FOOT

When walking around the local area on a matchday, please do not deviate from the pedestrian footpaths and avoid walking in the road, even if the pavement appears congested. This is particularly important on Aylestone Road and Narborough Road with the number of fastmoving vehicles passing.

BA CACFE

Leicester City are proud to promote all forms of green travel. As such, the Club encourages local supporters to utilise the cycle park by cycling to King Power Stadium.

Supporters travelling to King Power Stadium on bike can use the cycle park, free of charge. The facility offers 20 spaces on a first come, first served basis. Cyclists should enter via Car Park B and show their match ticket on arrival.



BY CAR

If you are approaching the stadium from the M1, please exit at J21 and follow the signs for the City Centre via the A5460. After three miles, turn right onto Upperton Road. Take the fifth exit at the Liberty Statue Island roundabout onto Raw Dykes Road for the stadium.

There are major roadworks taking place on Raw Dykes Road and Upperton Road which are likely to cause significant delay to your journey. If you are travelling by car via these roads, please allow for additional travel time to your journey.

Plan your journey in advance.

STADUM PARKING

CARS & COACHES


Limited supporter parking is available at the stadium, and must be pre-booked. Please call the City Sales Centre on 0344 825 5000 (Option 1) or **or book online here**: Match Day Parking. A cost of £10 per vehicle applies.

Limited coach parking is also available and must be pre-booked.

Additional local supporter parking is also available here. Please pre-book your parking to avoid disappointment.

PARKING WARNING:

- -Supporters are advised that vehicles will not be able to access the stadium site from 60 minutes prior to kick off until the match has started.
- -There are major roadworks taking place on Raw Dykes Road and Upperton Road. Please allow for additional travel time to your journey and plan your journey in advance.
- -There are also several independent car parks in the area surrounding King Power Stadium. The car parks are situated around Freemens Common and Leicester Tigers Rugby Stadium which is around a 10-minute walk from King Power Stadium.
- -Police and local authority parking restrictions, including permit schemes, are in place on more than 60 streets surrounding the stadium and are heavily enforced.

No child under the age of 16 will be permitted into the stadium unless accompanied by a responsible adult.

Children under 2 are not permitted into the stadium.

ACCESSIBILITY

Working alongside our host venues, we pride ourselves on being inclusive and working with all supporters. LCFC is committed to providing services and facilities for supporters with disabilities.

On matchdays, there is a dedicated stewarding team to help these supporters to ensure they enjoy their matchday experience. Each area of the ground has access for wheelchair users, while the concourses have accessible toilets, with access granted via RADAR keys, obtained from stewards or a member of our corporate stewards team. Other facilities available for supporters with disabilities to enhance their matchday experience at King Power Stadium, include:

AUDIO DESCRIPTIVE SERVICE

Headsets with full descriptive commentary can be provide for visually impaired supporters. These are available from the matchday staff entrance an hour and a half before kick-off. *Failure to return the headset may result in a charge.

HEARING LOOPS

Hearing loops are fitted and clearly signed at various locations around King Power Stadium including the ticket office, Foxes Fanstore, main reception and catering outlets.


PROHIBITED ITEMS

RESTRICTIONS

IS THERE A RESTRICTED BAG POLICY AT THE STADIUM?

If you must bring a bag, it <u>must be limited to just one</u> small bag or handbag no larger than 21cm x 30cm (equivalent to an A4 sheet of paper); anything bigger will not be allowed into the stadium.

For security reasons any bags or other property left unattended inside or outside the stadium may be investigated and removed immediately by our Safety Team or the Police.

Unfortunately, we cannot be held responsible for late admission or non-admission or other disruption to the event as a result of this policy, which is in place for the safety of everyone attending our venue.

CAN I SMOKE AT THE STADIUM?

There is no smoking or use of e-cigarettes permitted anywhere across the stadium campus.



OTHER INFORMATION

WHERE ARE THE STADIUM'S FIRST AID LOCATIONS?

In a medical emergency, fans should notify the nearest steward to mobilise one of the response teams to your location. There are also a number of defibrillators around the stadium to be used in the event of a cardiac arrest. First Aid rooms can also provide a quiet space in the event of a sensory overload for fans.

HOW CAN I REPORT ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR ON THE NIGHT?

If you witness or experience any behaviour in the stadium which you believe breaches Diversity & Inclusion Policy or falls below the standard of behaviour that you would expect, we encourage you to report it as soon as possible.

CAN I PRE-BOOK AUDIO DESCRIPTIVE COMMENTARY?

Headsets with full descriptive commentary can be provided for visually impaired supporters. These are available from the matchday staff entrance an hour and a half before kick-off.

WHAT HAPPENS TO ANY LOST ITEMS AT THE STADIUM?

Lost Property is initially held at the stadium for 48 hours. Please speak to a steward if you think you have lost something.

CAN I BRING FOOD INTO THE STADIUM?

It is not possible to bring food and drink into the stadium at this time. A range of food and drink options are available inside the stadium to cater for all dietary requirements.



OTHER INFORMATION

CAN I BRING A MUSICAL INSTRUMENT INTO THE STADIUM?

Whilst the FA have been given special permission for the England band to be in place for the fixture, fans are not allowed to bring musical instruments into the stadium.

CAN I BRING A BANNER OR FLAG INTO THE STADIUM?

Non-offensive flags should be no bigger than 2m x 1m. Please also bear in mind flag poles will not be permitted inside the Stadium.
